DREF - Anticipated Unmet Needs

The State of Missouri received more than 230 applications for funding in excess of \$250,000,000 for our PL-110-329 appropriation. This is nearly two and one half times the state's awarded grant amount. To date we have awarded 55,230,947 that are detailed in DRGR, with another \$25,071,500 committed and in process of executed grants. There are applications currently in our review and development process that will exceed the remaining Supplemental Appropriation and will be awarded based on competitive scoring.

Missouri is proposing to dedicate \$5M of funding to access a dollar for dollar match of \$5M more in DREF funds. The funds will be offered using a request for proposals or notice of fund availability method of distribution. Applicants will be evaluated on need, impact, and local effort. The State of Missouri has a significant amount of land mass residing in the 100 year and 500 year floodplain, as defined by the Federal Emergency Management Agency FIRM maps. Historically, the state developed using the river network (Missouri River and Mississippi River and their tributaries) as a transportation network to ship goods to the west. As such, communities developed and grew along those rivers and tributaries. That growth has contributed to flooding events that impact the health, safety and well-being of Missourian's. Loss of life and loss of homes, businesses, personal property and the devastation to real property has burdened the state during significant, widespread flooding events. Between 1990 and 2009, Missouri recorded more than 90 deaths due to flash and riverine flooding. Proof of that widespread damaging capacity came in the form of a Presidential disaster declaration for 106 of the 114 total counties in the State in 2008. Missouri is home to 977 cities, towns and villages in those 114 counties.

Since the floods of 1993, Missouri has created and implemented an aggressive buyout of properties in the floodplain and we have realized substantial savings as a result. More than 1000 properties have been purchased and deed restricted in perpetuity to open space activities in the last decade and one half. Those properties will never again receive a National Flood Insurance Program payment. They will never subject a resident to danger or experience damage to a structure. The program can be called a success. However, FEMA estimates that more than 216,000 households are within designated floodplains in Missouri. To date, in the short period between the notice of available DREF funding, wehave identified 5 more communities that are prepared to support more buyout activities. There are more eligible properties, more willing communities, and more families deserving of a decent, safe and sanitary comparable home, outside of the floodplain. Many of these communities will use CDBG funds to match FEMA Hazard Mitigation funding but there are additional, smaller river communities that are not eligible for FEMA funds, that our efforts could support, as well.

Even with the buyout activities, Missouri's communities will always be linked to the rivers. Their future, their viability and in many cases their economic activity is still linked to the waterways. It isoson, that access to fundingland use plte resourcev

able in Missouri for planning activities. We have regional planning commissions, councils of government, and federally designated economic development districts. Those service providers assist with economic development strategic planning, redevelopment planning and planning related to specific projects. There is however, a gap in a community's access to real land use planning.

Some mitigation efforts in Missouri have been driven by need as a response to an event. Land use planning will give many communities an opportunity to address that next step of development or redevelopment through a systematic analysis of land assets that derives efficient uses of land. A forward thinking land use plan will include views of the many facets of land use and the many impacts including the environment, society, and the local economy.

Areas of Greatest Need

The Consolidated Security, Disaster Assistance, and Continuing Appropriations Act (PL-110-329 and hereafter identified as the Second 2008 Act) appropriates over \$6 billion in CDBG funds for necessary expenses related to disaster relief, long-term recovery, and restoration of infrastructure, housing and economic revitalization in areas affected by hurricanes, flooding and other natural disasters that occurred during 2008. The allocation awarded to Missouri from this Supplemental Appropriation is \$92,605,490. There were six separate Presidentially-declared Disasters in Missouri during 2008. At least 3,892 homes were affected by weather related events in 2008, with 1,839 being affected, 1,488 sustaining minor damage, 320 sustaining major damage, and 245 being destroyed. At least 22 levees were affected by the flood; total estimated repair cost is \$36,139,000. U.S. Army Corps of Engineers funding will address the bulk of this; CDBG funding from the regular state program and from the First Supplemental Disaster Appropriation have assisted several communities in providing match for Corps funding. A portion of these levees are being addressed with existing CDBG funds, but total assistance needed by local governments and levee districts greatly exceeds existing funding.

At least two communities in northeast Missouri have reported businesses affected to the extent that buyout and relocation of these businesses is desired. Widespread damage to public infrastructure has been reported by communities and regional planning commissions.

The federal disaster declarations that are relevant to this supplemental appropriation are 1742, 1748, 1749, 1760, 1773, and 1809, and areas eligible for assistance are indicated on the FEMA website for the six declared disasters. All counties marked as designated during any 2008 disaster, as well as the cities within those designated counties, are eligible to apply for these supplemental funds. Areas not eligible for this funding include Benton, Caldwell, Clay, Clinton, DeKalb, Henry, Jackson and Lafayette counties.

Projects related to disaster relief, long-term recovery and restoration of infrastructure, housing and economic revitalization in areas affected by the declared disasters are prioritized as the areas of Greatest Need.

Amendment #2 to second Disaster Supplemental Action Plan

Unmet Need from 2008

Already reeling from multiple weather related events in 2008, the region had suffered previous loss of homes and businesses through tornados and flooding from which they had not recovered. Multiple Presidential disaster declarations were made as a result of the repeated damaging weather in 2008. In addition, 2010-2011 Tornado events have exacerbated needs in some areas. The state is proposing to allocate \$27,000,000 to allow communities affected by tornadoes in 2010 and 2011 to access 2008 Disaster Supplemental funds to address housing and economic revitalization needs that were exacerbated by the 2010/2011 events, or otherwise meet unmet needs from 2008. While specific detailed grantee activities are still being determined, housing and business lending and demolition activities are expected to comprise all of the reserved amount. Initial estimate of business lending is being allocated at \$3,000,000. The \$3,000,000 is set up as a project in the action plan, and the remaining \$24,000,000 is set up as a project until specific housing and other activities are identified.

Project Dates and Duration of Assistance, Locations/Responsible Organizations

Projects being undertaken as part of this supplemental appropriation will follow the same guidelines for project period as the state's regular non-entitlement CDBG allocation. All Grantees are local governments that will have 24 months from the time of award to expend and close-out

Amendment #2 to second Disaster Supplemental Action Plan

On December 31st, 2010 a tornado struck Lambert Airport in St. Louis and the surrounding neighborhoods and businesses in St. Louis City and County causing significant damage to homes and businesses in the area.



On May 22, 2011 an EF-5, multi-vortex tornado struck the heart of Joplin, Duquene and parts of Jasper and Newton Counties, leaving a six mile long and one mile wide path of destruction to homes, businesses, and infrastructure forever changing the fabric of this community and region. The tornado caused a tragic loss of life with current related deaths at 155, which is higher than any death toll from a tornado in 50 years. There are a large number of individuals still hospitalized from the tornado, many fighting to survive.

On May 25th, 2011 a tornado struck Pettis County causing damage to a mobile home park, businesses and school property. Each of these tornados has caused damage to the housing and the economic infrastructure of the communities. Although the current impacts are not directly related to the damage suffered in 2008, each has unmet needs from 2008. Through this amendment, these communities may access CDBG, under the eligible categories and eligible activities listed in this Plan, to address these current and unmet needs.

Staff sent participants copies of the HUD brochure, which describes their rights under the acquisition provisions of the Uniform Act and the City of Ferguson's Voluntary Buyout Policy. In order to help with the timing of this process, the City had participants also sign authorization forms for the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to release information about possible National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). City staff is currently working to secure a real-estate/property appraiser, to use during the appraisal process. Addition authorization forms will be sent to participants, to gage their willingness to continue participating in the flood buyout program. This program is 100% voluntary and participants may drop out at any time.

Matching Funds for Acquisition of Properties is approximately 83% of the funds have been used. Staff is trying to acquire seven (7) additional properties to be included in this project and will use h remaining



matching funds.

Demolition is approximately 66% complete and approximately 63% of the funds have been used.

To date, TA Contracting razed fourteen (14) homes, which include: 2 Burdale Ct., 3 Burdale Ct., 5 Burdale Ct., 10 Burdale Ct., 32 Suburban Ave., 44 Suburban Ave., 200 Suburban Ave., 204 Suburban Ave., 240 Suburban Ave., 318 Suburban Ave., 400 Suburban, 404 Suburban, 412 Suburban Ave., 416 Suburban Ave. Since staff will be acquiring seven (7) additional properties, the remaining demolition funds will be used.

Relocation for the acquired properties is 100% complete and approximately 21% of the funds have been used. Since staff will be acquiring seven (7) additional properties, the remaining relocation funds will be used.

St. Louis 08-DI-78: The City submitted an official proposal to the Department of Economic Development on December 11, 2013 in which we requested that the funding for Tornado Relief be reallocated in order to make infrastructure repairs to Lewis Place to include the installation of street lighting, sidewalk repairs, street repaving and other repairs. The request was formally approved by the Department of Economic Development on December 31, 2013.

Because Lewis Place is a private street, there is a longstanding City ordinance that 2/3 of the property owners affected have to agree to make Lewis Place a public street so that the City can take over maintenance, i.e. street cleaning, repairs, lawn care of the median, etc. Once the necessary approvals have been obtained by the property owners, then the project will be turned over to the City's Board of Public Service so that they can advertise for bids for the work that needs to be done. Given that Lewis Place has been a private street for well over 100 years, it will likely take a series of community meetings before a consensus is reached.

On June 12, 2015, CDA, the City Counselor's Office, Board of Public Service and Street Department met in order to get the project back on track. It was decided in the meeting to revise the scope of work as the previous estimates exceeded the amount of this grant. Once the revised scope of work is finalized, and any legal issues are resolved, an Environmental Review will be submitted to the State.

After a significant delay, the project has gotten back on track. The legal issues concerning what is required regarding the level of participation by individual property owners has been resolved. However, activities will need to be carefully coordinated with individual owners to ensure that all of their concerns about the project are addressed during this pre-development phase. The revised scope of work has been finalized and the Environmental Review will be submitted to the state during the first half of 2016. Once the Environmental Review process is complete, the project scope of work will be finalized and incorporate any changes required by the ER. The project will then be bid out.

St. Joseph Metro Chamber 08-DI-91: To date, a cumulative total of 51 BCDAI participants have received grant funds allowing them to enroll in university coursework leading to bachelor's degrees. Fifteen recipients have graduated. Four additional recipients have been accepted into the program but have not yet engaged in grantfunded training. Conversations are ongoing with additional potential student participants and partnering businesses. At the time of this report, there are no data (graduates) to report for the first quarter of 2016. The approved application for this grant noted, "the greatest perceived need was for current employees to complete a bachelor's degree and to receive

on-site training and mentoring from the corporation" in order to be retained or promoted. Thus, weknew the project would extend over a number of years as participants pursued degrees, while working in positions from which they would be promoted. With 51 BCDAI funded participants including 15 bachelor's-level graduates who have increased their value to their company and who have increased their contribution to the economic vitality of the region, the BCDAI has positively impacted the community. Nevertheless, the number of participants needs to be increased and the participants

need to be supported as they work within thei copany and as they pursue a baccalaureate degree.

In order to increase the number of partnering companies and to increase the number of workers selected for funded training, recruitment activities continue among regional industries. As a result, several regional industries have expressed an interest in becoming a partner in the Buchanan

County Degree Attainment Initiative (BCDAI). Unfortunately, many do not currently have employees or interns who meet the "low or moderate income" criterion for this program. Thus, the work continues to locate qualified employees and interns whose program participation will help the BCDAI achieve the economic development outcomes outlined in the grant application.

Joplin Chamber 08-DI-92: The Joplin High School Innovation Campus program began the school year with 51 students (28 juniors and 23 seniors). Due to several unforeseeable events we have lost six students this school year. Students were withdrawn from the program for the following reasons: poor health due to injuries from the 2011 tornado, child birth, pregnancy, moving out of state, lack of effort, and withdrawn from high school for non-attendance. Seniors in the program, with the help of Jim Kimbrough, director of the Missouri Southern State College Talent Search program (a TRIO program) have completed their college application and FAFSA application. They will complete an evaluation of the Innovation Campus program next week. Juniors in the program are getting ready to take the April ACT. This assessment will assist us with enrolling the students into appropriate dual credit courses for next year. Sophomores eligible for the program have recently taken the COMPASS exam. We are in the process of selecting qualified students into the program for the 2016-2017 school year based on the eligibility requirements of the grant and a personal interview.

Johnson County ED 08-DI-93: Job Training (Public Service): he UCM Innovation Campus (MIC) continued to provide job training to a total of 68 with the net loss of 2 students from the 4th quarter 2015. At the end of the 1st quarter, 50 of the 76 students have advanced in the program and are also gaining on-the job work experience at seventeen (17) business & education partners. Three (3) new business partners were added during the quarter for a total of 38 business & education partners. To estimate percent of



activity completed, the amount of CDBG activity funds drawn to date (\$132,073.31) is divided by the total amount of the activity grant award (\$949,500). Based on this measure, 14% of the activity has been completed. Administration: During the 1st Quarter 2016, the administration completed the QPR Report for period enin 12/31/2015. A CDBG Request for Funds #3 in the total amount of \$70,568.42 was processed, submitted and payments dispersed accordingly during the quarter. To estimate percent of activity completed, the amount of CDBG administration activity funds drawn to date (\$6,604.06) is divided by the total amount of the administrative grant award (\$47,475). Based on this measure, 14% of the activity has been completed.

Southeast Missouri State University: The Spring 2016 semester began at Southeast Missouri State University on January 19, 2016. The Innovative Campus Initiative assisted 11 eligible students with University fees associated with the spring semester. The 11 eligible students are enrolled in 146 credit hours this semester. The current semester will continue until May 13, 2016, thus no credit hours were completed during this reporting quarter. Completion of these credits will be reported in the next quarterly report. The total number of Southeast Missouri State University Agribusiness students majoring in Agribusiness who have received tuition assistance through the Innovative Campus Grant is 57 students. The original goal was 50 students. Information about the Innovative Campus Initiative along with the application for the summer 2016 semester have been e-mailed to all University Agribusiness majors. The information explained that those who had applied early in the current academic year do not need to re-apply, but anyone who has not applied this year may apply for Summer 2016 assistance. Information about th nnovative Campus Initiative along with the application for the 2016-2017 academic year were e-mailed to all University Agribusiness majors. Applications should be received by July 11, 2016 in order to be evaluated timely prior to the Fall semester.

St. Louis County Economic Development Partnership 08-DI-96: Pharmacy Technician Course Participants. College Credit courses through STLCC. Administrative: Currently finishing development of a Life Science Laboratory Certificate agreement with STLCC, allowing High

School students to attain certificate allowing them to work in all variety of Bio/Medical Laboratory enivonments; Further development of STEM Pathways in Information Technology, Health Science, and Advanced Manufacturing; Further development of physical STEM lab, including a dedicated Computer Science/Information Technology lab; Continuance of STEM Advisory Committee comprised of Staff, Students, and Industry representatives; Building of a sim lab for Certified Nursing Associate program with 4 hospital beds, 4 practice manikins, and otherCNA equipment at Pattonville High School; Continuance in our health/medical professions through our Pharmacy Tech program, our Certified Nursing Associate program, and our Project Lead The Way Biomedical Science program. Our PLTW program just gotcertified by PLTW, and will be a 4-year pathway at the beginning of the 2016-2017 school year, and students willbe able to receive college credit for those courses through Missouri S&T. In fall 2016, we will offer college creditthrough Lindenwood University for our Biology and Chemistry courses, as well as our Exercise Science course. We are also working with Fontbonne University to offer Bioinformatics dual credit opportunities.

For Information Technology, we have adopted a Project Lead The Way based curriculum for Computer



Science. Our student interest has grown exponentially in the program, our students have and our instructor was one of approximately 30 teachers nationwide to be trained for the pilot year of the latest Project Lead The Way course. We plan to offer Cyber security the following school year as well. We will be offering dual credit opportunities for Web Publishing and Computer Applications. We are also pursuing extensive partnerships with Fontbonne University in the areas of Computer Science, Cybersecurity, and Bioinformatics (which actually combines health/medical professions with information technology). Furthermore, we are pursuing the possibilities of having a CISCO academy in-house, or offering students the opportunity to get such CISCO certifications at St Louis Community College.

In Advanced Manufacturing, we are actively working with St Louis Community College to find opportunities for our students, particularly through the Emerson Center for Engineering and Manufacturing. We currently offer college credit opportunities for students with Computer Aided Drafting, Computer Aided Drafting II, Digital Electronics, and plan to offer credit for Principles of Engineering this fall through Saint Louis Community College.STEM Career Fair for students; STEM Camp to try to bring more middle-schoolers into STEM interests in IT, Advanced Manufacturing, and health/medical professions.

Bi-State Development Agency 08-DI-97: Of the 5 year to date 47 completed the program in year one. Last year an additional 98 students were enrolled in the program. Of those approximately 40 were juniors and are expected to be enrolled in the program for 2015-16 school year. Additionally, St. Louis Community College has enrolled an additional 53 new students for the 2015-16 school year.

St. Louis Community College is continuing to evaluate additional instructors and programs for eligibility in the future. Administrative Activities: SLPS has obtained approval for the low income verification documentation for year one of the program from the Missouri Department of Economic Development and is preparing billing for BSDA. SLPS is awaiting additional low income verification for year two of the program at the request of the Missouri Department of Economic Development. SLPS has handed out low enrollment forms to students for this school year and has been in contact with District personnel to verify low income status. SLPS continues to work with schools to ensure that course sequencing for dual enrollment students are accurate.

St. Louis Small Business Empowerment Center 08-DI-98: The Innovation Campus Programs operated at Ferguson Florissant and North County Tech launched the second semester of the 2015-2016 academic year during the Quarter. By the end of this Quarter we can report the following enrollment levels: At North County Tech: 42 enrollees, 27 of whom met program income guidelines, were enrolled in the program by the end of the Quarter. At Ferguson-Florissant: 3 enrollees all of whom are eligible for free or reduced lunches. The St. Louis Carpenters Joint Apprenticeship Program continued to provide the journeyman level instructor, David Goetz to the program at Ferguson-Florissant while at North County Tech instructors are state certified vocational faculty members. As the program has done in the past facility exchanges continued during the semester to provide instructions from nationally certified instructors in safety and welding that allowed participants to earn national certifications. As noted in previous reports, these exchanges are an integral part of the program's partnership between the current Innovation Campus programs; a model we plan to continue and grow as part of our efforts following the conclusion of the first three year cycle of the Innovation Campus program. The Ferguson-Florissant instructor offered OSHA Safety training at North County Tech while his students took welding at North County Tech.

Ferguson-Florissant: Enrollment at Ferguson Florissant for the 15-16 academic year has been disappointing. From the initial group of 15 applicants nine (9) dropped out; most as a result of scheduling problems. Of the six enrolled at the beginning of the first semester only five successfully completed the first semester and two transferred leaving only 3 participants during this, the second semester. That said, the value of the program for previous graduate s has led us to explore the program's extension by combining this effort with the School's successful Project-Lead—the-Way program, an effort that we plan to implement should our upcoming request for a no-cost extension be approved. During this semester students began welding, in collaboration with North County Tech. Also during this quarter the seniors have been enrolled at the nter for Workforce Innovation taking the class in Maintenance & Hydraulics in January. In March they he covered the Composites units.

In February both classes received instruction and safety tests on the Drill Press, Band Saw and Bench Grinder. Currently the junior class finished up on the OSHA 10 General Industry Certification. All Passed. They are starting a wood Framing/drywall/taping/installing Crown molding, chair rail, and base molding in April.

North Tech: At North Tech of the 27 of 42 eligible students in the advanced manufacturing enrollment is as follows:: Welding -14 are currently enrolled during this semester; Precision Machining- 5 are enrolled



for the second semester; Production Engineering (Advanced Manufacturing) - 8 are enrolled for the second semester. These figures represent a small increase from the number who completed the first semester. Overall enrolment in these programs grew to 42 by the end of the quarter.

During the quarter students from Ferguson –Florissant spent two weeks at North Tech where they were introduced to basic welding in: smaw (stick), gmaw (mig) Oxy fuel and plasma shape cutting. Each student completed a welding project utilizing the skills they learned from their participation in the training. In addition North Tech students were provided certification opportunities to earn certificates in OSHA General Industry Safety, OSHA Construction Safety, and Forklift from The Ferguson-Florescent instructor. Also during the quarter seniors were provided an opportunity to earn CPR certifications.

Seniors enrolled at North Tech will be provided opportunities to earn AWS (American Welding Society) certifications by the end of the current semester.

Highlights of the program at North Tech this year through this quarter include: Follow-up surveys were conducted on previous program graduates which indicated 100% senior placement in work or post-secondary education; During the Quarter North Tech students had the opportunity to visit the Pipe Fitters Training Center where they learned of the job and career opportunities available to them following graduation; Students will be participating in the National Cart in St Charles on April 6th where they will participate in written and hands on welding testing; North Tech received a new piece of equipment this year, a Torchmate CNC programmable plasma cutting table which offers students new opportunities to learn skills on one of the latest pieces of equipment used in advanced manufacturing.; Both North Tech juniors and seniors are learning how to program in the Torchmate Cad software; Based on the School's focus on preparing its graduates for employment and advanced training leading to good jobs and living wage employment North Tech seniors were involved during the quarter in mock interviews with Ameren, Laclede and the Metropolitan Sewer District.

One of the highlights of the program this year at North Tech has been the successful launching of the North Technical High School Robotics Team. While still only in its first year it is working to become the first team from the region to win the Foundation for Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology's (FIRST) Robotics competition.

FIRST® (For Inspiration and Reonition of Science and Technology) mission and goal is to inspire young people's interest in science and technology. FIRST is organized as a not-for-profit public charity. They offer four programs, including the FIRST Robotics Competition for grades 9-1 (ages 14-18). The North Tech team is a diverse and committed group of Innovation Campus students, unrelenting instructors, and undying creativity. The North Tech Robotic Team has created and built a robotic that is capable of communicating with a controller and performing competitively with machines designed by their peers. This has included assembly and wiring of the Robotic, programming software for pneumatics and building a FRC Robotic. This machine is entered into a competition that combines the excitement of sport with the rigors of science and technology. The robotics competition pairs high school students with adult mentors (primarily engineers and teachers) to design and build robots that compete against one another in a high energy environment that combines the practical application of science and technology with the fun, intense energy and excitement of a championship-style sporting event.

Future Plans: Over all while we have been disappointed with enrollment levels during the first three years of the program the success of graduates in obtaining good jobs and/or pursuing further training and education has led us to launch efforts to modify and extend the program, not only with Ferguson-Florissant and North Tech the program but to other schools, serving at-risk students in the St. Louis Region. Preliminary Acquisition Letters and Brochures have been sent by certified mail. 0% of funds have been drawn for this activity.

DB Water Distribution: This activity is the same as above for wastewater collection. There may not be enough funds for the water distribution. 0% of funds have been drawn for this activity.

Administration: Environmental 100% complete. Housing furtherance for current year 100% complete which included publication of April is Fair Housing Month. CDBG bank account 95% complete – just need to submit to CDBG. Files have been set up. 0% of funds have been drawn for this activity.

No Contract awards were made this quarter in any of categories. No funds for any of the activities listed



above have been requested.

St. Louis County 08-DI-102: This report covers activity during the months January, February, and March for the St. Louis County Girls Incorporated (Girls, Inc.) Nelson Center renovation. The substantial majority of project activity occurred during the second guarter of 2014.

There was no activity during the first quarter of 2016.

Slater 08-DI-103 All four houses in Slater are complete, including sidewalks.

All four houses are now occupied with Hab Center Clients with 40-45 jobs saved. Continue to search for 2 lot locations in Marshall to build 2 more houses.

St. Louis Regional Chamber (Launch Code) 08-DI-104: Over the past few months, LaunchCode has helped many individuals find employment in the St. Louis region*. The goal is to look at the individual and their talents, rather than the path it took to get there and whether it lines up with what's considered traditional in the tech field. For example, LaunchCode helped Ricardo Antonetti, whom LaunchCode has been mentoring and training through its education program in its Miami office. Prior to LaunchCode, Ricardo was a valet driver, and recently secured a position at his "dream job" at Boeing, first as an apprentice and then as a full time employee with the company. He relocated to St. Louis with his partner, who also landed a coding internship through LaunchCode, and son.

Taney County 08-DI-105: Acquisition: 100% Complete CDBG Environmental Review approved 9/30/15. Authorization to use funds approved 9/30/15. Project funded to County 9/30/15 and will fund to sub-recipient on 10/1/15. This is our only CDBG activity. Construction started 10/6/15 and is approximately 40% complete as of 3/31/2016

Cortex 08-DI-106: The acquisition of the site has been completed-100% complete.

Demolition: Demolition has been completed-100%. Abatement: Abatement has been completed-100% Facility Construction: Design for facility construction is complete-100%. Procurement for construction has been completed-100%. Contracts awarded and Start of Construction has been issued. Construction is underway-70% completed. Administration-75% complete.

SLATE 08-DI-107: To date SLATE has placed a total of 1031 young people. This is 103% of goal. The goal will be met by the end of the contract. SLATE provided direct services in the areas of youth workforce development, mentoring, financial literacy, supportive services, and summer jobs. . All youth were given the opportunity to open a free checking and savings accounts with direct deposit.

SLATE provided sixteen hours of Job Readiness Training and Financial Literacy. Some of the topics for Job Readiness Training were time management, workplace attitude, work place expectations, workplace attire, conflict resolution, leadership skills, and many other skills that would help a young person flourish on a job. Helping the unbanked market in Saint Louis City was a major goal in the summer jobs program. The financial literacy component this year was extremely robust. 98% percent of the students opened a checking and savings account for the first time. The summer jobs program was extremely special and the funding made a tremendous difference in many lives. Each participant has a job coach, case manager, and mentor. Young people learned about careers, scholarship opportunities, and stayed positively engaged with the program the entire summer.

St. Louis County 08-DI-108: The fourth quarter of 2015 began with the conclusion of the Summer Job League (SJL) in which Better Family Life, Inc. successfully placed more than 500 youth participants into a meaningful work experience. Youth wer place din the field of Healthcare, Hospitality, Retail, Office Administration, Food Service, Veterinary Services, Local Government Agencies and Municipalities, Community Serving Agencies, Childcare Facilities and private Sector Businesses. Ten percent of the participating youth were offered permanent employment opportunities by the end of the program. By the end of the fourth quarter Better Family Life, Inc. had enrolled 21 youth into the WIOA Out of School Youth Program with a new enrollment goal of one hundred. Twenty-three of the program 154 participant who have never been placed, were replaced into employment and 5 participants were enrolled in post-secondary institutions or skill based training. The Urban League of Metropolitan St. Louis, Inc. placed 401 participants in the Summer Job League (SJL) program and 23 participants in the State Park Youth Corp (SPYC) Program. Participants were placed in the following Industries: Healthcare Facilities, Education and Training, Hospitality and Tourism, Business Management and Administration. Eight youth from the Summer Job League Program obtained permanent employment. 3 with Lot of Luv Childcare, 2 with New North Side Childcare Center, one with Myrtle Hilliard Health Center, one with O'Henry Restaurant and one with Proficient Chiropractic.
