#### **Narratives**

#### **Disaster Damage:**

DREF - Anticipated Unmet Needs The State of Missouri received more than 230 applications for funding in excess of \$250,000,000 for our PL-110-329 appropriation. This is nearly two and one half times the state's awarded grant amount. To date we have awarded 55,230,947 that are detailed in DRGR, with another \$25,071,500 committed and in process of executed grants. There are applications currently in our review and development process that will exceed the remaining Supplemental Appropriation and will be awarded based on competitive scoring. Missouri is proposing to dedicate \$5M of funding to access a dollar for dollar match of \$5M more in DREF funds. The funds will be offered using a request for proposals or notice of fund availability method of distribution. Applicants will be evaluated on need, impact, and local effort. The State of Missouri has a significant amount of land mass residing in the 100 year and 500 year floodplain, as defined by the Federal Emergency Management Agency FIRM maps. Historically, the state developed using the river network (Missouri River and Mississippi River and their tributaries) as a transportation network to ship goods to the west. As such, communities developed and grew along those rivers and tributaries. That growth has contributed to flooding events that impact the health, safety and well-being of Missourian's. Loss of life and loss of homes, businesses, personal property and the devastation to real property has burdened the state during significant, widespread flooding events. Between 1990 and 2009, Missouri recorded more than 90 deaths due to flash and riverine flooding. Proof of that widespread damaging capacity came in the form of a Presidential disaster declaration for 106 of the 114 total counties in the State in 2008. Missouri is home to 977 cities, towns and villages in those 114 counties. Since the floods of 1993, Missouri has created and implemented an aggressive

buyout of properties in the floodplain and we have realized substantial savings as a result. More than 1000 properties have been purchased and deed restricted in perpetuity to open space activities in the last decade and one half. Those properties will never again receive a National Flood Insurance Program payment. They will never subject a resident to danger or experience damage to a structure. The program can be called a success. However, FEMA estimates that more than 216,000 households are within designated floodplains in Missouri. To date, in the short period between the notice of available DREF funding, we have identified 5 more communities that are prepared to support more buyout activities. There are more eligible properties, more willing communities, and more families deserving of a decent, safe and sanitary comparable home, outside of the floodplain. Many of these communities will use CDBG funds to match FEMA Hazard Mitigation funding but there are additional, smaller river communities that are not eligible for FEMA funds, that our efforts could support, as well. Even with the buyout activities, Missouri's communities will always be linked to the rivers. Their future, their viability and in many cases their economic activity is still linked to the waterways. It isoson, that access to fundingland use plte resourcevctivities. We have regional planning commissions, councils of government, and federally designated economic development districts. Those service providers assist with economic development strategic planning, redevelopment planning and planning related to specific projects. There is however, a gap in a community's access to real land use planning. Some mitigation efforts in Missouri have been driven by need as a response to an event. Land

use planning will give many communities an opportunity to address that next step of

Amendment #2 to second Disaster Supplemental Action Plan Unmet Need from 2008

Already reeling from multiple weather related events in 2008, the region had suffered previous loss of homes and businesses through tornados and flooding from which they had not recovered. Multiple Presidential disaster declarations were made as a result of the repeated damaging weather in 2008. In addition, 2010-2011 Tornado events have exacerbated needs in some areas. The state is proposing to allocate \$27,000,000 to allow communities affected by tornadoes in 2010 and 2011 to access 2008 Disaster Supplemental funds to address housing and economic revitalization needs that were exacerbated by the 2010/2011 events, or otherwise meet unmet needs from 2008. While specific detailed grantee activities are still being determined, housing and business lending and demolition activities are expected to comprise all of the reserved amount. Initial estimate of business lending is being allocated at \$3,000,000. The \$3,000,000 is set up as a project in the action plan, and the remaining \$24,000,000 is set up as a project until specific housing and other activities are identified. 2008 Disaster Declarations in Missouri:

Ferguson 08-DI-74:Acquisition: six of the seven properties have been acquired this quarter. The owner of the seventh (336 Suburban), has not responded to our final offer. To date, 14 homes (Phase 1) have been purchased and demolished by the city's voluntary flood buyout program. Six homes in Phase 2 have been

purchased. Demolition contract bid: the contract for demolition of these properties was bid through a competitive RFP process; DBE/MBE firms were actively sought and solicited. The winning bidder (alpha & omega demolition LLC) is a certifiedDBE/MBE contractor, and has been issued a Notice to Proceed for 11 Burdale and 324 Suburban. Relocation offers in process: the owners of the four remaining rental properties and their tenants have contacted us about the relocation process. Research on comprable properties was done before the closing and 90-day clock was started. Lists of comparable properties have been assembled for all four properties, and are being inspected by our inspector for safe and sanitary conditions; his report will be submitted to the state shortly. Units planned to assist: The City will be assisting with relocation of the homeowners/tenants of the following seven properties:

7 Burdale Court, 8 Burdale Court, 304 Suburban Avenue, 422 Suburban Avenue,11 Burdale and 324 Suburban are vacant, and 336 Suburban is owner occupied. If the owners of 336 accept the City's offer to purchase they will be offered relocation, as the documents submitted with the offer indicated this was the policy, and that cannot be rescinded now that the offer was made.

The costs to date are: Appraisals for seven (7) properties: \$425 apiece, or \$2,975.00

St. Louis 08-DI-78: During the 1st QTR, MODED informed CDA the funding would be extended until 12/31/2018 in order to complete additional work using unspent funds. LCRA Holdings contacted SBC Contracting who provided additional bids for 1) spot curb repair on the interior median of Lewis Place and 2) additional sidewalks on Marcus Ave. that were not included in the initial scope. The Streets Department also completed minor repairs and lowered the height of several speed bumps that had previously been installed. Construction is approximately 90% complete. 79% of CDBG funds have been expended.

Neighborhood Life House 08-DI-82: Community Facility: The equipment is all installed at their permanent sites. \$30,020 of the remaining funding will be converted to lead remediation in Mineral Park for new, clean topsoil to be installed on the .7 acre area that currently exceeds the minimal exposure limits. Currently waiting on tribal approval for proposed borrow site, and then will proceed with seeking bids for topsoil purchase/delivery to Mineral Park. See following notes regarding the remaining CDBG funding. It will used to purchase clean topsoil to cover it. 90% Complete. Administration: The close out monitoring was held on September 13th with continued correspondence between HSTCC and DED to finalize the paperwork since that time. The HSTCC is currently waiting on addressing the Mineral Park issue and then once that is complete, they will work on providing close out documentation to CDBG to close out. 90%

Duquesne 08-DI-83: Rehabilitation of residential structures: The rehabilitation has been finished and is complete. 100% Complete. : Reconstruction of residential structures: All Construction activities are complete on all units funded by this project. 100% Complete.

Demolition: All demolitions were complete by the end of the quarter. 100% Complete.

Asbestos Inspection: There will be no need for asbestos inspections fo the project. 100% Complete. Other



Professional Services: There were no other professional services this quarter. 100% Complete. Rehab/Demolition Inspection: There were no demolition inspections this quarter. 100% Complete. Audit: The closeout monitoring was conducted during this quarter, still waiting on correspondence letter from CDBG to complete closeout. 90% Complete. Administration: The HSTCC has provided all administrative services for the above work for the period. 95% Complete.

#### Joplin Area Habitat for Humanity 08-DI-84: Project Closed

St. Louis County 08-DI-85: Streetscape: 76% with \$1,620,890.97 spent to date. Raineri Construction is the general contractor and construction started in August 2016. The Lemay Streetscape is close to completion with the raingardens, ramps, and walks with concrete and pavers, benches, bike racks, and bus enclosure having been installed. We are currently working to gain the approvals needed to use remaining funds on upgrading the rain/sewer infrastructure in the area to protect the new improvements installed in this area. Engineering Design: 101% complete with \$343,292.76 spent to date. Design and engineering are complete. The construction documents are complete. The balance of these funds will be spent on construction administration. Engineering Inspection/Construction Inspection: 54% complete with \$78,233.75 spent to date. The MoDOT inspector, ABNA Engineering, is completing daily inspections on compaction, moisture and PSI testing of the concrete. All testing results have met the required thresholds. Other Professional Services: 99% with \$264,999.79 spent to date. The traffic study and civil survey of the project area have been completed. Carmody MacDonald was hired as the acquisition consultant and provided assistance with purchasing the necessary easements for the project. Administration: 72%. An administrative charge of \$52,719.26 has been made to the grant. Acquisition: 89% with \$46,082.15 spent to date. All final temporary and permanent easements necessary to proceed with construction of the streetscape improvements have been acquired. The cost for easement acquisition was less than anticipated, and a budget adjustment to reallocate funds was submitted and approved.

#### Full Employment Council 08-DI-86: Project Closed

Greene County - SBDC 08-DI-87: At the start of the spring semester, the HPA cohort students were enrolled in 56 college classes. The cohort is set to earn 164 college credits by the end of the 2018 spring semester. The cohort will average 10.9 college credits per student this semester. At the start of the semester, eight of the seventeen HPA students participated this semester in paid medical internships at local hospitals, Cox Health & Mercy in Springfield, MO. With successful completion students will earn four college credits. In the medical internship course students are serving in various hospital programs including the following departments: Pediatrics, Dialysis, Simulation Lab, Neurology, and Safety/Security. The HPA counselor assisted HPA students with attending, "The Infinite Scholars." Minority students were transported to St. Louis, MO to meet with several colleges in the St. Louis area whom were recruiting minority students to attend their schools. Schools that participated included St. Louis University, Harris-Stwe State University, and many others. Some participants were offered scholarships if they agreed to colleges in which they were recruited. The HPA counselor assisted students with applying for post-secondary planning, helping students apply to college. HPA counselor assisted HPA students with filing out college applications, transcripts, writing recommendation letters, and contacting admissions counselors. The HPA counselor provided various college scholarship to HPA seniors, for which they were encouraged to apply. Two workshops were held to assist students with how to search for scholarships. The HPA Counselor held a FAFSA Frenzy during the 3rd guarter, to assist students with filling out the FAFSA for the next school year. The HPA counselor assisted all of the 12th grade HPA students with attending the STAR Summit at Ozarks Technical Community College (OTC). During the STAR Summit HPA and other Middle College seniors met with OTC advisors who assisted them with continuing in college, developing a program of study, and conducting a degree audit at OTC for the 2018-19 school year. HPA students were invited to meet with a forensic medical nurse. The forensic nurse came and explained the duties of a forensic nurse, and how someone becomes a forensic nurse. The forensic nurse explained in detail the issues involved in forensic nursing including: addressing victims of sexual assault and rape, sex trafficking, child abuse/neglect, and elderly abuse/neglect. Legal & Ethical issues were discussed when addressing forensics nursing. During this quarter two of the HPA participants moved from the Springfield area to live with another parent. Both students began the 3rd quarter participating in the HPA program but at various times during the 3rd quarter, two students moved back into the home of a different custodial parent. In separate situations these students moved to live with a different parent after their home lives became chaotic and unpredictable. It was determined by the parents, in both cases, moving from their current situation was in the best interest of the child. Recruitment /Evaluation /Selection of students for next program cohort: The HPA counselor has been interviewing potential students who were seeking to enroll at the Middle College for the 2018-19 school year. HPA counselor was involved with touring several high school and



middle school students on a tour of the OTC campus. Showcasing The Middle College and the medical programs of Ozarks Technical Community College. The HPA counselor and the assistant director were invited to present to a group of students about the Middle College and its various programs. Administration: Middle College Principal went to several Springfield high schools to speak to potential 10th and 11th grade students to recruit them for the Middle College program. It was arranged for the 4th quarter that a pediatrician will be coming to The Middle College to present to students about applying to medical school and working in the area of pediatric medicine. The HPA counselor has been working with Springfield Business Office, the OTC finance office, and the representative from the Missouri Department of Economic Development to close out the Innovations Grant. Completion Letters have been mailed. The following forms were recently sent: Public Hearing minutes, Direct Beneficiary Appications, Project Accomplishments. The Springfield Business office has been submitting various reports directly to the Compliance Specialist. Upon the completion of this quarterly report, it too will be submitted to the Missouri Department of Economic Development, for review.

Lake Ozark 2008-101:The construction of the water and sewer improvements are 100% complete and the contractor has been paid in full. The 44 apartments were completed in March, 2018. As of March 13, 19 apartments out of 44 units have been rented. The City has requested and received approval to use some remaining grant funds to overlay the city streets adjacent to the Fish Haven Apartments site as they are in bad need of repair and overlay mainly due to the construction traffic during the construction of the apartment projects. At this time, the City is in the process of awarding a contract to an engineer for the work and approving the amendment to the administration contract. The amendment to the environmental has commenced. The engineer will start the bidding/contract documents as soon as their contract is awarded. Bidding would then proceed once the environmental amendment is approved and



bidding/contract documents are ready.

St. Louis Co- Nelson Center 08-DI-102: Project closed 7/18/17

Slater 08-DI-103: All six ADA homes have been completed. All homes are fully occupied by 3 low income clients for a total of 18 clients. Each home is staffed 24 hours a day by caregivers.

St. Louis Regional Chamber (Launchcode) 08-DI-104:For the first quarter of 2018, LaunchCode placed 44 apprentices/candidates into permanent job positions in the St. Louis region. Rather than poaching employees from companies in the tech ecosystem, the organization seeks to expand the talent pool altogether by providing opportunities to candidates lacking in traditional credentials but nevertheless possess the requisite skills for a high-paying tech job. In addition to the 44 placements/conversions, 9 other successfully-placed candidates were omitted due to their Illinois residence and/or workplace being in Illinois. The strong performance is largely due to robust partnerships being formed with local businesses as well as more innovative training programs which make indemand skills more available in the area. This quarter exceeded its goal of 20 placements by nearly 225% because of the development of new partners in Q3/Q4 and many of our previous company partners finding success with past candidates and coming

back to us with greater trust in our apprenticeship system. Nearly two-thirds of apprenticeship placements in Q4 came from low-to-moderate income households, with 54.55% representation from low income households. One great story from our Q1 placements is Kourtney Smith, who was in a low-income household as a single, African American female. She held down a part-time job while taking our classes and was eventually placed in a programming role at MasterCard. Additionally, we were excited to take on two candidates (Ryan Walker and Ryan Neal from our apprenticeship pipeline to work with current candidates at LaunchCode.

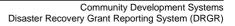
MACOG 08-DI-109:The Mid-America Regional Council (MARC) imported the Homeland Security funded deployable assets into a web-based system that local stakeholders can access and provide visibility to local jurisdictions of the resources available for response. Southwest Missouri COG has completed the Climate Vulnerability Assessment and the low water crossing inventory and prioritization in Polk, Dade and Dallas Counties. Mark Twain RCOG completed the Storm Shelters-Evacuation Center- Recovery Center inventory and mapping project and shared the results with local jurisdictions. East-West Gateway COG completed a comprehensive survey of deployable resources within its region. Northeast Missouri RPC has identified all of the low water crossings within its region and is proceeding with mapping and evaluation process. Mid-Missouri RPC has completed its GIS mapping for Russellville utilities, Moniteau County low-water crossings, Callaway County Tier II Hazardous Substance mapping, and Cooper County Warning Siren project. Green Hills RPC has completed the inventory of all "flash flood points" in its 11 county region and continue analysis of infrastructure needs and relationship to regional public events and population activities. . Boonslick RPC has completed its mapping and planning outreach activities to local jurisdictions. Northwest Missouri RCOG has completed the regional inventory of events and gathering spaces and is approximately 90% complete with the county road assessments. Meramec RPC completed a survey of alert messaging systems within its region and a vulnerable population study to inform discussions on how to improve emergency communication and response. MRPC prepared a toolkit of materials to increase awareness and understanding of the floodplain permitting process

Land Clearance for Redevelopment 08-DI-110: The Land Clearance for Redevelopment Authority (LCRA) of the City of St. Louis is working with Drury Development on the reopening and new construction of Lucas Avenue between Lumiere Place Boulevard (3rd Street) and 2nd Street in Laclede's Landing. The purpose of this project is to eliminate slum and blight by providing better vehicular and pedestrian access to Laclede's Landing. Design work will be paid using private funds and will not seek funding from this grant award. Discussions are ongoing with Drury and it is expected that they will wrap up in April 2018.

Central Region Workforce Investment Board Inc. 08-DI-111:

The project has been more successful than expected. The original estimated number of users was 100; however, 480 users have participated to date. As participants graduate from the program the open space are quickly filled as seen by the 33 participants added this quarter.

T-REX Technology Entrepreneur Center 08-DI-112: During this quarter, DED, TREX, and the city worked with HUD on completing the environmental review process. No CDBG funds have been drawn. At the same time, and with a different funding source, T-REX worked with architects on the design of the space





that will be remodeled with CDBG funds. The architects will have final drawings within the next two weeks (by April 30), and the bid package for the general contractor has been sent for review to both the state and city before it is posted. We are still on target for project completion by September/October 2018.

Green Hills RPC 08-DI-113: Meetings were held in all 10 counties during January 16, 17, and 18. Stakeholder meetings were also held at the end of each day to allow the general public to participate. Industrial parks sites were also visited and inventoried for future consideration of industries. A follow up visioning meeting was held in Milan on March 15th.

A formal presentation of the full plan is scheduled for April 24thin Brookfield.

The strong performance is largely due to robust partnerships being formed with local businesses as well as more innovative training programs which make in-demand skills more available in the area. This quarter exceeded its goal of 20 placements by nearly 225% because of the development of new partners in Q3/Q4 and many of our previous company partners finding success with past candidates and coming back to us with greater trust in our apprenticeship system. Nearly two-thirds of apprenticeship placements in Q4 came from low-to-moderate income households, with 54.55% representation from low income households.
