DREF - Anticipated Unmet Needs The State of Missouri received more than 230 applications for funding in excess of \$250,000,000 for our PL-110-329 appropriation. This is nearly two and one half times the state's awarded grant amount. To date we have awarded 55,230,947 that are detailed in DRGR, with another \$25,071,500 committed and in process of executed grants. There are applications currently in our review and development process that will exceed the remaining Supplemental Appropriation and will be awarded based on competitive scoring. Missouri is proposing to dedicate \$5M of funding to access a dollar for dollar match of \$5M more in DREF funds. The funds will be offered using a request for proposals or notice of fund availability method of distribution. Applicants will be evaluated on need, impact, and local effort. The State of Missouri has a significant amount of land mass residing in the 100 year and 500 year floodplain, as defined by the Federal Emergency Management Agency FIRM maps. Historically, the state developed using the river network (Missouri River and Mississippi River and their tributaries) as a transportation network to ship goods to the west. As such, communities developed and grew along those rivers and tributaries. That growth has contributed to flooding events that impact the health, safety and well-being of Missourian's. Loss of life and loss of homes, businesses, personal property and the devastation to real property has burdened the state during significant, widespread flooding events. Between 1990 and 2009, Missouri recorded more than 90 deaths due to flash and riverine flooding. Proof of that widespread damaging capacity came in the form of a Presidential disaster declaration for 106 of the 114 total counties in the State in 2008. Missouri is home to 977 cities, towns and villages in those 114 counties. Since the floods of 1993, Missouri has created and implemented an aggressive buyout of properties in the floodplain and we have realized substantial savings as a result. More than 1000 properties have been purchased and deed restricted in perpetuity to open space activities in the last decade and one half. Those properties will never again receive a National Flood Insurance Program payment. They will never subject a resident to danger or experience damage to a structure. The program can be called a success. However, FEMA estimates that more than 216,000 households are within designated floodplains in Missouri. To date, in the short period between the notice of available DREF funding, wehave identified 5 more communities that are prepared to support more buyout activities. There are more eligible properties, more willing communities, and more families deserving of a decent, safe and sanitary comparable home, outside of the floodplain. Many of these communities will use CDBG funds to match FEMA Hazard Mitigation funding but there are additional, smaller river communities that are not eligible for FEMA funds, that our efforts could support, as well. Even with the buyout activities, Missouri's communities will always be linked to the rivers. Their future, their viability and in many cases their economic activity is still linked to the waterways. Amendment #2 to second Disaster Supplemental Action Plan

Unmet Need from 2008

Already reeling from multiple weather related events in 2008, the region had suffered previous loss of homes and businesses through tornados and flooding from which they had not recovered. Multiple Presidential disaster declarations were made as a result of the repeated damaging weather in 2008. In addition, 2010-2011 Tornado events have exacerbated needs in some areas. The state is proposing to allocate \$27,000,000 to allow communities affected by tornadoes in 2010 and 2011 to access 2008 Disaster Supplemental funds to address housing and economic revitalization needs that were exacerbated by the 2010/2011 events, or otherwise meet unmet needs from 2008. While specific detailed grantee activities are still being determined, housing and business lending and demolition activities are expected to comprise all of the reserved amount. Initial estimate of business lending is being allocated at \$3,000,000. The \$3,000,000 is set up as a project in the action plan, and the remaining \$24,000,000 is set up as a project until specificic housing and other activities are identified.

Ferguson 08-DI-74: Acquisition: CDBG funds are being used to pay for the project's acquisition costs and for professional services related to the acquisition of the flood plain buyout properties, such as, for appraisal and title services costs. 68% of the acquisition line item funds have been drawn and expended by the city to date. The city is in the process of acquiring 6 more properties. To date, 7 homes have been purchased and demolished by the city's voluntary flood buyout program. Request for extension of project submitted and approved. With th assage and collection of the City's Economic Development Sales Tax, we now have the funds to provide the City's match to the grant. Owners were re-noticed a request to participate; as of this date, 6 of the 7 property owners have agreed to do so. A revised request for bids from appraisers was distributed to prior bidders (the appraiser used for Phase 1 retired), as well as a selection of residential appraisal companies from the approved list from the Missouri Division of Professional Registration.

St. Louis 08-DI-78: Construction on the Lewis Place Public Improvement Project was completed in the 4th Quarter. During the 4th Quarter, SBC Contracting Inc. completed construction on 4500-4700 blocks of Lewis Place. Approximately 4,038 linear feet of curbs and approximately 3,588 linear feet of sidewalks were replaced. Following the completion of the curbs and sidewalks, the City of St. Louis Streets Department completed the milling and repaving of approximately 3,588 linear feet on the 4500-4700 blocks of Lewis Place.

CDA submitted a request for payment to MODED for invoices from SBC Construction and Fred Weber Inc. (Materials Supplier for the Streets Dept.) This is the final programmatic report for this project. Construction is 100% complete. 79% of CDBG funds have been expended. Request for funds was submitted at the end of December, but was not approved and drawn until January 2018.

There will be no need for asbestos inspections for the project. 100% Complete. There were no other professional services this quarter. 100% Complete. There were no demolition inspections this quarter. 100% Complete. The closeout monitoring was conducted during this quarter, still waiting on correspondence letter from CDBG to complete closeout. 90% Complete. TheSTCC has provided all administrative services for the above work for the period. 95% Complete.

Joplin Area Habitat for Humanity 08-DI-84: Project Closed

St. Louis County 08-DI-85: Streetscape: 75% with \$1,594,941.57 spent to date. Raineri Construction is the general contractor and construction started in August 2016. The Lemay Streetscape is close to completion with the raingardens, ramps, and walks with concrete and pavers, benches, bike racks, and bus enclosure having been installed. We are currently working to gain the approvals needed to use remaining funds on upgrading the rain0sewer infrastructure in the area to protect the new improvements. Engineering Design: 100% complete with \$343,292.76 spend to date. Design and engineering are complete. The balance of these funds with be spent on construction administration. Engineering inspection/Construction Inspection: 54% complete with \$78,233.75 spent to date. The MoDOT inspector, ABNA Engineering, is completing daily inspections on compaction, moisture and PSI testing of the concrete. All testing results have met the required thresholds. Other Professional Services: 99% with \$264,999.79 spent to date. The traffic study and civil survey of the project area have been completed. Carmody MacDonald was hired as the acquisition consultant and provided assistance with purchasing the necessary easements for the project. Administration: 72% An administrative charge of \$52,719.26 has been made to the grant. Acquisition: 89% with \$46,082.15 spent to date. All final



temporary and permanent easements necessary to proceed with construction of the streetscape improvements have been acquired. The cost of easement acquisition was less than anticipated, and a budge adjustment to reallocate funds was submitted and approved.

Greene County - SBDC 08-DI-87: \$572,781.25 was deobligated on June 12, 2017. The total amount of CDBG funds expended on this project was \$427,218.75. The final RFF for this project, #9, was processed by DED on September 11, 2017. A total of 74 LMI students benefited from this Health Professions Academy (HPA) program. Refer to attached, more detailed narrative for more HPA program information.

Jefferson City Area Chamber 08-DI-88: After deobligating \$929,503.21, the remaining project budget was \$70,496.79. The project has ceased operations. \$45,969.79 of the project budget was ecpnded. Therfore, \$25,000 remains to be de-obligated. 5 students were assisted.

Innovate St. Louis 08-DI-89: Project Canceled

St. Charles EDC 08-DI-90: As previously indicated, we are in closeout – the two remaining/obligated students are working through their programs of study.

St. Joseph Metro Chamber 08-DI-91: The Buchanan County Degree Attainment Initiative has 24 active participants remaining in the grant and progressing toward graduation at the end of 2017. Forty-one of the current 74 participants have graduated. Two additional students who transferred to another university or changed employment are also progressing toward graduation. Of the 74 funded participants, to date 41 have oained a degree (39 baccalaureate degrees, 2 associate degrees). These individuals have increased their value to their company and have increased their contribution to the economic vitality of the region. Of the 18 industry partners, 12 sponsored employees, interns, or potential employees for the BCDAI grant scholarships. In addition to the 18 industry partners, 3 education partners, including Missouri Western State University, Metropolitan Community College, and North Central Missouri College, provided coursework students completing degree programs.

Joplin Chamber 08-DI-92: Job Training: 16% complete/CDBG funds drawn to date.

Administration: 16% complete/CDBG funds drawn to date. The school year began with fifty-five (55) students participating in the Joplin High School Innovation Campus Program (23 seniors and 32 juniors). One student graduated at the semester, leaving fifty-four (54) students enrolled in the program for the second semester (i.e., January to May 2018). All fifty-five students completed the semester in good standing. This semester students carried an average of six credit hours, with ten students carry ten or more hours. The state is closing out the state funding allocation for the Innovation Campus grant but will continue to authorize reimbursement of expenditures for students already in the program. A closeout monitoring and audit visit of our program was held on December 5, 2017 at the Joplin Area Chamber of Commerce. Mr. James Figueroa-Robnett, Jr., Compliance Specialist with the Missouri Department of Economic Development, conducted the review. Later in the month, on December 18, 2017 Mr. Rob O'Brien, President of the Joplin Area Chamber of Commerce, held a related Public Hearing, as required by the grant. The Joplin Innovation Campus committee feels this program has been successful and could be replicated in cities around the state to create a highly trained workforce for Missouri. We are grateful to the State for giving us the opportunity to provide students, who might not have thought they were college material, the confidence and ability to jump start their college education for a brighter future. Joplin High School Graduate Follow-Up data indicates 25 of the 27 Innovation Campus students from the Class of 2017 are currently enrolled in college. Johnson County ED 08-DI-93: Job Training: 68% Completed Expenditures/100% of CDBG funds drawn from MDEDCDBG. Administration: 68% Completed Expenditures/100% of CDBG funds drawn from MDEDCDBG. The Missouri Innovation Campus began in 2012 with financial support through the CDBG2008DI93 in the Summit Center, Room 105, Lee's Summit MO 64063. Today, with a steady increase in students, the Missouri Innovation Campus is located in the new Summit Technology Academy located at 1101 NW Innovation Parkway, Lee's Summit.MO 64086.

The Missouri Innovation Campus (MIC) is an innovative approach to workforce and talent development between the Lee's Summit R7 School District, Metropolitan Community College and the University of Central Missouri. By engaging business partners and community organizations, The MIC is reshaping the way students experience education. The MIC students graduate with: A bachelor's degree, two yeasafter high school. Little to no student debt, Applied experience through paid internships, Highly soughtafter skills for highpaying careers, A Degree in Less Time. Academic programs at The Missouri Innovation Campus focus on the science, technology, engineering and mathematics fields.

The only thing left is the removal of a tree in the yard at 472 S Grant in Marshall, at a cost of \$2500.00. This will be done when weather permits and that will be the final request on this CDBG. Close-out monitoring was done on September 27 & 28, 2017 Housing Construction - \$3,825.65 remains to be drawn for tree removal work.

St. Louis Regional Chamber (Launchcode) 08-DI-104: For the fourth quarter of 2017, LaunchCode placed 25 apprentices into permanent jobs in St. Louis. Rather than poaching employees from companies in the tech ecosystem, the organization seeks to expand the talent pool altogether by providing opportunities to candidates lacking in traditional credentials but nevertheless possess the requisite skills for a high-paying tech job. In addition to the 25 placements, 4 other candidates were omitted due to their Illinois residenct. The strong performance I largely due to robust partnerhips being formed with local businesses as well as more innovative training programs which make in-demand skills more available in the area. While this performance is a step back from Q3's 44 apprentice placements, we still had a strong quarter, exceeding our goal of 20 placements per quarter. We find it very promising the 80% apprenticeship placements in Q4 came from low-to-moderate income households, with 48% from low income households.

The Boonslick RPC is working with each of their counties to gather data and begin continuity of operations plans, and continued work with Old Monroe and Winfield on their community preparedness plans. BRPC also advanced the Montgomery County GIS, Warren County Infrastructure and Marthasville GIS mapping planning projects. The Meramec RPC completed the first draft of their region-wide alert messaging systems study, conducted their survey and analysis for a draft vulnerable populations study and assisted the city of Steelville with critical zoning and disaster preparedness mapping. MRPC also completed work with local jurisdictions and stakeholders to analyze current floodplain permitting practices. Kaysinger Basin has completed their Benton and Henry Counties Disaster Related Land Use Plans and hosted a series of successful Disaster Recovery Trainings for their local jurisdictions.

Land Clearance for Redevelopment 08-DI-110: The Land Clearance for Redevelopment Authority (LCRA) of the City of St. Louis is working with Drury Development on the reopening and new construction of Lucas Avenue between 3rd Street and 2nd Street in Laclede's Landing. The purpose of this project is to eliminate slum and blight by providing better vehicular and pedestrian access to Laclede's Landing from downtown St. Louis. Several meetings have taken place including one with a potential civil engineering firm that may be contracted to do the surveying and engineering design work for the project. Any such design work will be paid using private funds and will not seek funding from this grant award. Discussions are ongoing with Drury for the construction of the street improvements with the City of St. Louis's administration. Another meeting will be held in January to resolve these issues. Construction should begin 2nd quarter 2018 and be completed in summer 2018. Total Activity Budgeted: \$300,000. Total Activity Funds Drawn for Quarter: \$0
