

# Notice of Funding Availability - CDBG Long Term Recovery for Improvements to Public Infrastructure and Facilities

## Notice of Funding Availability - CDBG Long Term Recovery Grant Program

### **OVERVIEW**

The Missouri Department of Economic Development (DED) hereby notifies interested Applicants of the availability of funds allocated from the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program. The availability and use of these funds is subject to Federal CDBG regulations (24 CFR Part 570, Subpart I), and is further subject to the State CDBG policies and program requirements. DED is the administrator of the State of Missouri's CDBG Program for Non-Entitlement Communities.

In releasing this Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA), the goal of DED is to provide a funding gap to assist communities with remaining unmet needs for long term recovery for public infrastructure or facilities damaged or destroyed by a presidentially declared disaster event. In accordance with the Stafford Act, Duplication of Benefits will be screened. CDBG funds may not be supplanted for other available federal funding resources, however CDBG funds can be used as the non-federal match for FEMA Public Assistance projects.

### **ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS**

Units of general purpose local government (cities or counties) that do not participate in HUD's CDBG Entitlement program and have received a presidentially declared disaster under:

Severe Storms, Tornadoes, Straight-Line Winds, and Flooding  
(Incident Period May 3-May 4, 2020)

Severe Storms, Tornadoes, Straight-Line Winds, and Flooding  
(Incident Period April 29, 2019 and continuing)  
DR-4451-MO

Severe Storms, Tornadoes, Straight-Line Winds, and Flooding  
(Incident Period March 11-April 16, 2019)  
DR-4435-MO

Severe Storms, Tornadoes, Straight-Line Winds, and Flooding  
(Incident Period April 28-May 11, 2017)  
DR-4317-MO

Local Governments may apply by submitting a proposal through an open cycle application submission. When a proposal is approved by DED, a full application will be requested for submission in order to receive a funding award.
